San Francisco Public Works ("Public Works") announces a Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") inviting Contractors to submit their qualifications for evaluation to be pre-qualified and therefore eligible to bid on a forthcoming Advertisement for Bids for construction of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project. Interested Contractors responding ("Proposers") to this RFQ are to be construction firms capable of performing construction of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funded bridge construction projects involving scope that includes, but is not limited to, repair or replacement of damaged steel members and welds, concrete counterweight repair, repair piles that support the bridge structures and piles supporting the bridge's two auxiliary buildings, rehabilitation and possibly replacement of bridge fenders, removal and replacement of steel bridge deck, spot removal of rust and application of associated priming and recoating, and repainting of bridge. The Third Street Bridge is located in a densely populated urban environment immediately adjacent to the San Francisco Giants home stadium, and only limited shutdowns to vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be allowed during construction.

Work shall comply with all applicable codes and regulatory agencies' standards having jurisdiction over the design, construction and operation of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project.

The current engineer's estimate for construction of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project is in the range of \$20 million.

Late submissions will not be considered. Postmarks will not be considered in judging the timeliness of submissions. Proposals submitted by fax or electronic mail (email) will not be accepted.

No contractor or subcontractor may be listed in a bid or awarded a contract for a public works project unless registered with the California Department of Industrial Relations ("DIR") as required by Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for proposal purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)].

Contractor shall comply with the highest prevailing wage rate requirement, which is the higher rate between the current General Wage Rate Determination made by the Director of the DIR and the Federal General Prevailing Wage Determinations of the Secretary of Labor under the Copeland Act Contractor shall also comply with 49 Code of Federal Regulations Appendix to Part 26, Participation by Disadvantaged Businesses Enterprises,

In accordance with San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6, no proposal is accepted and no contract in excess of \$600,000 is awarded by the City and County of San Francisco until such time as (a) the Mayor or the Mayor's designee approves the contract for award and (b) the Director of Public Works then issues an order of award. Pursuant to Charter Section 3.105, all contract awards are subject to certification by the Controller as to the availability of funds.
